Grace's parents cornered the eagle and caught it with a blanket. The Raptor Center called and asked if there was any "blood or bones" sticking out, which there was not.

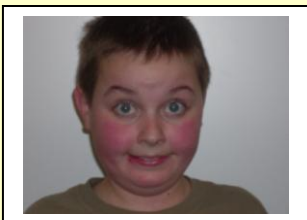
The following day Grace was picked up from school to watch the eagle get transferred. Watch out for flying eagles!

If you see him in the halls say hi!

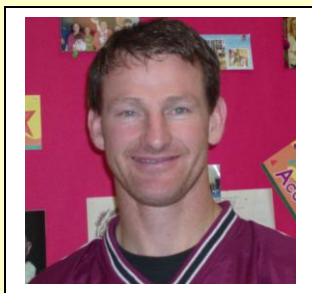

Donkey Basketball

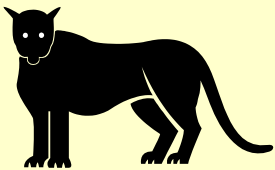
