### **STAR Testing Update**

Initial results of the most recent STAR testing for reading and math have been positive and encouraging. Students are showing growth in both areas. In fact, as a school, all but one class experienced growth in both areas. This is very exciting.

Students will take the STAR tests three different times during the school year. Staff utilize the data to determine needs for individual students, groups of students, and whole classes. As a staff, we are working all year to ensure our instruction meets the students where they are and brings positive growth for each student. At the time of this writing, we still have a few students to test for Reading, Math, or both tests. Make up for these tests will be during 4th hour on Tuesday, December 5 in the Media Center.

### **Panther Hour, Homework Help, Saturday School**

We have several ways to help students with coursework. If your students have needs regarding a specific course, the best and most efficient way is to insist that the students connect with the course teacher directly. This is the main purpose of Panther Hour. Students are given time each day during Panther Hour to reach out to the teacher and complete their work. Teachers are not teaching at this time to ensure they are available.

Outside of Panther Hour, teachers are willing to meet with students before or after school by appointment. Additionally, after school Monday-Thursday, we offer a homework help room from 3:10-4:00 or 4:30, depending on the needs of the students. No appointment is necessary. Students are welcome to go to the homework help room (109) after school. Finally, Saturday School is offered on select Saturdays throughout the year. All students needing a quiet place to study, access to a teacher, access to the internet, and/or school supplies are welcome. Please take advantage of our programs. It is our utmost goal to help each student be successful in their courses.

### **New and Noteworthy at PPHS**

This school year marks the first year of the Robotics course, under the direction of Career and Technical Education instructor, Mr. Jon Oestreich. On December 2, 2017, The team went to its first competition in St. Cloud. The regional competition included 40 teams. PPHS teams placed 38th and 16th.
